Sub: Matter related to permission given for a period not exceeding five years to **Parul Institute of Ayurveda, P.O. Limba, Tal. Waghodia, Distt. Vadodara-391760 Gujarat** under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970 – **Hearing Notice** – reg.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to the Ministry's order No.R.12011/04/2005-EP (IM-1) dated 17.10.2016 granting permission for a period of not exceeding five years from the session 2016-17 to 2020-21 with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 60 seats 10 PG courses namely (i) Kaumarbhritya, (ii) Shalya Tantra-Kshar Karma evum Anushastra Karma (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga, (iv) Kayachikitsa, (v) Dravyaguna Vigyana, (vi) Rasashastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana, (vii) Kriya Sharir, (viii) Rognidan & Vikriti Vigyan (ix) Ayurved Samhita Sidhant (x) Rachana Sharir with 6 seats in each course and the Ministry's order dated 29.11.2016 to open new Post Graduate course of Study in 03 subject namely (i) Shalakyta Tantra and (ii) Panchakarma (iii) Shalya Tantra (Samanya) with 06 seats in each course under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970.

2. The aforesaid college was inspected by the surprise visitation team in accordance with Rule 3 (2) of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirement of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016 on 27-28.03.2018 to ascertain the position/status of the ASU colleges and submitted the inspection report to the Central Government.

3. And on examining the said report in terms of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016, IMCC (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, other relevant regulations made there under, several fundamental deficiencies were observed which are adversely affecting the purpose of quality medical education. Therefore, the Ministry vide letter dated 21.06.2018 directed the college to rectify the deficiencies within a period of 20 days (i.e., 11th July 2018) and submit the compliance report otherwise it was further informed that the permission granted for a period of five years shall deemed to be withdrawn.

4. In response to the Ministry's letter dated 21.06.2018, the Principal, Parul Institute of Ayurveda, P.O. Limba, Tal. Waghodia, Distt. Vadodara-391760 Gujarat has submitted a compliance report dated 28.06.2018 to this Ministry which was received on 06.07.2018. However, on analysis of the submitted compliance report it appears that, the college is still not fulfilling the following requirements:

- i. Required additional Professors in each concerned 7 PG Dept. namely (i) Ayurved Samhita Sidhant, (ii) Kriya Sharir, (iii) Rasashastra & Bhaisajya kalpana, (iv) Rognidan & Vikriti Vigyan, (v) Prasuti Tantra & Stri Roga, (vi) Kayachikitsa, (vii) Panchakarma are not available as per RMS, 2016.
- ii. All the Final year PG students of all the Departments were absent. Sufficient number of PG students were running absent since long say for 6-7 months and their attendance was marked as absent. HOD sanctioned the leave but not clearly mentioned about the type of leave and in some applications even dates for which leave was sanctioned not found.
- iii. As per visitation report students often remain absent for long duration. Many students remain absent before the sanctioned duration of leave.
- iv. The authorities could not give any convincing reasoning for the absence of PG students.
- v. The authorities failed to provide the biometric attendance of the PG scholars and a convincing reasoning for the absenteeism of students.
- vi. College website is not updated as per sub-regulation (2) of regulation 9 of RMS, 2016

5. In view of the above deficiencies, as mentioned in para 4, you are hereby given an opportunity of hearing in terms of the provisions of the first proviso to sub-section (5) of section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, at 10:30 AM on 01.08.2018, before the designated Hearing Committee in the Ministry of AYUSH to present your case and clarify the above position and to show cause as to why the permission of the college granted for a period of five years from the academic year 2016-17 to 2020-21, issued vide orders dated 17.10.2016 and 29.11.2016, should not be withdrawn and also as to why the permission to take admissions for the year 2018-19 should not be denied to your college.

6. It is pertinent to mention here that, to substantiate the authenticity of the documents submitted, in the above said compliance report; you are hereby requested to bring all the originals.

7. It is further directed that you may make oral as well as written submissions before the designated hearing committee and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof in original to substantiate your claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above and submit an authenticated copy for evidence/verifications by the Central Government as under:

- i. The supporting documents may be the original/attested legible copies of the PG degree of the teachers/consented teachers, the attested copies of the experience certificates, the appropriate office order of the college for any reallocation, the attendance register up to the visitation day, the time table indicating the engagement of the teachers, the details of the other duties as carried out by the teachers or any other documents related to availability of the teachers.

for any reallocation, the attendance register up to visitation day, the time table indicating the engagement of hospital staff etc. or any other documents related to availability of the hospital staff etc.

- iii. The supporting documents may be with respect to the deficiency of OPD/IPD like central registration for maintaining the records of patients in OPD and IPD patients, laboratory and radiological investigation reports, IPD medicine dispensing registers, IPD diet register, duty rosters of hospital staff, birth and death certificates, etc. for the whole reporting year (2017) to substantiate the claim of genuine functional hospital fulfilling the norms as specified in sub-regulation (2) of regulations (7) of notified RMS.
- iv. The supporting/ relevant documents with respect to construction of college as well as hospital like architectural map/ proposed building Plan/ Zoning Plan/ Elevation Plan/ Department wise construction area as per RMS, 2016 and any other documents relevant to the deficiencies as indicated above.
- v. Similarly, the supporting documents may be with respect to other deficiencies like Instruments/Equipment's etc.

8. It may please be also noted that in case you do not attend the hearing at the stipulated time and date, it will be presumed that you have nothing to say in the above said matter and further necessary action in terms of the IMCC Act and the relevant regulations will be taken based on available records.

9. This issues with the approval of competent authority.
