Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Parul Institute of Ayurved & Research, At. Ishwarpura, P.O. Limda, Ta. Waghodia, Distt. Vadodara-391760, Gujarat (Inst. ID. AYU0469)** inspection was conducted on **15.04.2025 and 16.04.2025 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the permission with an intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 2nd Renewal of Permission in 14 PG courses with 84 seats in the subject namely (i) Ayurveda Samhita evam Siddhanta-06 seats (ii) Rachna Sharir-06 seats (iii) Kriya Sharir-06 seats (iv) Dravyaguna Vigyana-06 seats (v) Rasashastra evam Bhaishajya Kalpana-06 seats (vi) Roga Nidana evam Vikriti Vigyana-06 seats (vii) Agada Tantra-06 seats (viii) Prasuti evam Stri Roga-06 seats (ix) Kaumarabhritya-Balaroga-06 seats (x) Swasthavritta-06 seats (xi) Kayachikitsa-06 seats (xii) Shalya Tantra-06 seats (xiii) Shalakyatantra-06 seats and (xiv) Panchkarma-06 seats, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.**
- 2) As per the Regulation no. 04 of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda, Regulations, 2024 published on 01st October, 2024 there shall be 18 Postgraduate programs in Ayurveda on and from the date of publication of the said Regulations Shalakyatantra Postgraduate program has been divided into **Shalakyatantra- Netra Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Ophthalmology) & Shalakyatantra- Karna, Naasa and Mukha Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Oto-Rhino Laryngology and same was informed to you vide letter Ref. No.-3/2025/MARB/General Matters dated 05.05.2025. In response of the same you have sent an email dated 16.06.2025 in which for 03 seats of Shalakyatantra you have opted for Shalakyatantra- Karna, Mukha & Nasa Roga for 03 seats. However, as per MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024 it is mandatory to bifurcate the seats in both the departments. Accordingly, as per your request your Shalakyatantra seats are bifurcated into Netra roga- 03 seats.**
- 3) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report shortcomings/defects were observed and same was communicated to you vide letter of even no. 19.06.2025.** In response on the same you have submitted the clarification **vide an email dated 23.06.2025.**
- 4) Accordingly, the submitted clarification and the assessment report was once again carefully examined in terms of concerned Acts & Regulations and provision under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations **thereunder, and after verification observation is as under:-**

As per Fil No. 26-75/MARB 25 (Visitation) Point No. 4(i), the shortfall of Higher Faculty for UG may kindly be reconsidered, as it falls within the 10% relaxation limit.

1. For PG, the department has 2 Professors, which fulfils the required guide ratio of 1:3 (3 students per professor). Hence, there is no shortcoming for PG. In addition to this we have recently appointed Dr. Sulabha Bhosale, Professor, AYPS00754.

2. The department has 1 Professor, 1 Reader, and 1 Lecturer, and the PG guide-student ratio is matches as per norms (3:2:1 respectively).

3. For PG, the department has 2 Professors, which fulfils the required guide ratio of 1:3 (3 students per professor). Hence, there is no shortcoming for PG.

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- 5) The submission made by the college during clarification and assessment report have been carefully examined in terms of the concerned Acts & Regulations and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and as per the direction of the competent authority the assessment report along with clarification report was placed in the **133th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **11.07.2025** and **Board decided to provide an opportunity of hearing to the college for the remaining shortcoming as mentioned above.**
- 6) Accordingly, as per the decision of the Board **an opportunity of hearing was granted to your college vide letter of even no. dated 19.07.2025 to appear on 21.07.2025** and the college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide an email dated 20.07.2025 against** the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. B G Kulkarnee, Principal of the college,** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **21.07.2025** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. (a) For PG Course:-

As per sub-Regulation 2 of Regulation 19 of MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024, The Teacher student ratio shall be subject to availability of student-Postgraduate guide in the ratio of 3:1, for three students for one Professor; in case of Associate Professor 2:1 two students for one Associate Professor; and in case of Assistant Professor the ration is 1:1 one student for one Assistant Professor.

In Department of Agad Tantra & Vidhi Vaidyaka - College is having 04 eligible teacher (01 Professor, 01 associate professor & 01 assistant professor for UG and 01 assistant professor for PG) and there is shortcoming of 01 higher Faculty for PG, and no Assistant professors are having the required teaching experience for guide ship. Accordingly as per the available faculty, college is not fulfilling the teacher student ratio as per the submitted seats in Part-1 and **eligible for issuance of permission for only 05 seats (instead of 06 seats).**

Accordingly, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of extended permission with an intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 2nd Renewal of Permission in 14 PG courses with 83 seats (instead of 84 seats) in the subject namely (i) Ayurveda Samhita evam Siddhanta (06 seats) (ii) Rachna Sharir-06 seats (iii) Kriya Sharir-06 seats (iv) Dravyaguna Vigyana-06 seats (v) Rasashastra evam Bhaishajya Kalpana-06 seats (vi) Roga Nidana evam Vikriti Vigyana-06 seats (vii) **Agada Tantra-05 seats (instead of 06 seats)** (viii) Prasuti evam Stri Roga-06 seats (ix) Kaumarabhritya-Balaroga-06 seats (x) Swasthavritta-06 seats (xi) Kayachikitsa-06 seats (xii) Shalya Tantra-06 seats (xiii) Shalakya Tantra -06 seats (opted for shalakya tantra- Netra roga- 03 seats & shalakya tantra- Karna, Naasa and Mukha Roga- 03 seats) and (xiv) Panchkarma-06 seats for the academic session 2025-26, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020.

- 8) Therefore, Extended Permission is hereby granted to Parul Institute of Ayurved & Research, At. Ishwarpura, P.O. Limda, Ta. Waghodia, Distt. Vadodara-391760, Gujarat (Inst. ID. AYU0469) in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and as per the Policy letter dated 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 2nd Renewal of Permission in 14 PG courses with 83 seats (instead of 84 seats) in the subject namely (i) Ayurveda Samhita evam Siddhanta-06 seats (ii) Rachna Sharir-06 seats (iii) Kriya Sharir-06 seats (iv) Dravyaguna Vigyana-06 seats (v) Rasashastra evam Bhaishajya Kalpana-06 seats (vi) Roga Nidana evam Vikriti Vigyana-06 seats (vii) **Agada Tantra-05 seats (instead of 06 seats)** (viii) Prasuti evam Stri Roga-06 seats (ix) Kaumarabhritya-Balaroga-06 seats (x) Swasthavritta-06 seats (xi) Kayachikitsa-06 seats (xii) Shalya Tantra-06 seats (xiii) Shalakya Tantra -06 seats (opted for shalakya tantra- Netra roga- 03 seats & shalakya tantra- Karna, Naasa and Mukha Roga- 03 seats) and (xiv) Panchkarma-06 seats, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcomings shall be fulfilled along with the following conditions:-
- I. Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 15% of Postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of with in 14 PG courses with **83 seats (instead of 84 seats)** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 9) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 10) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 11) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

12) Compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.

13) **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**

- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
- ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
- iii) All the requirements of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda, Regulations, 2024,
- iv) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
- v) The remaining shortcomings mentioned in Para no. 6 above, shall be fulfilled.

14) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
